Dr Vincent Mor is the Florence Pirce Grant University Professor of Health Services, Policy & Practice at the Brown University School of Public Health. For nearly 40 years, Dr Mor's research has focused on health care delivery and experiences of frail and chronically ill people from variation in health services. Over the last 10 years, Dr Mor has led a large study funded by the National Institute on Aging, called "Shaping Long Term Care in America". He is now testing several clinical trials of nonpharmacological treatments for people with dementia that are fully embedded in functioning health care systems.

Professor Henry Brodaty AO (MB BS, MD, DSc, FRACP, FRANZCP, FAHMS) is a researcher, clinician, policy advisor and strong advocate for people with dementia and their carers. As well as being a prolific researcher with over 500 publications in refereed journals, he is a senior psychogeriatrician and Head of the Memory Clinic at Prince of Wales Hospital in Sydney.
